

Teambuilder: "FROST BITE"

Target Audience: All Teams

Purpose

"Teambuilder" PACEsetters are designed to put a select group of people into a simulated scenario in order to help the individuals grow closer together and identify as a team. The scenarios include stressors (i.e. complicated problems, time limits, resource constraints, etc.) that are used to help make the scenario challenging, fun, and educational. Each Teambuilder is designed in such a way that allows for flexibility and creativity in its execution. Description

This Teambuilder is a table top scenario designed to:

- 1. Help individuals work together in a time constrained environment
- 2. To collaborate on how a project should best be accomplished

The scenario involves a simulated scenario where your teams are arctic explorers travelling across the frozen landscape when a sudden storm hits and the team must build an emergency shelter to survive.

Employ

Group Size: 4-6 people per group

Time: 30 - 40 minutes

Materials: 1 packet of construction materials (card stock paper, toothpicks, rubber bands, and sticky notes) for

each team and 1 x electric fan

Your teams are no longer sitting in your office, they're Arctic explorers trekking across the frozen tundra! Have each team elect a leader to guide their expedition.

When a sudden storm hits, the team must erect an emergency one-person shelter to survive. Give each team a set of construction materials and give them 30 minutes to construct their shelters. When time runs out, turn on the electric fan's arctic winds and see who successfully built a shelter that will keep them safe. Adjust the difficulty with sturdier construction materials (provide Popsicle sticks instead of toothpicks, duct/scotch tape etc.), by changing the fan's settings, or by having the fan running while the team constructs their shelters.

Debriefing questions:

What was the most difficult aspect of this exercise? How did you handle conflict amongst the team members? What would you do differently if given the chance?
