Lieutenant Colonel Trevor Rosenberg is the Operations Division Chief, Educator & Leadership Advisor for the Air Force Profession of Arms Center of Excellence (PACE). The PACE is responsible to the Chief of Staff of the Air Force for infusing the Air Force Core Values within the Profession of Arms and across the Air Force, via identity-based education & training, tools, and assessments.

Lieutenant Colonel Rosenberg entered the Air Force in 1993 as a graduate of the Brigham Young University ROTC program. He has served in various intelligence operations assignments from unit level to Headquarters U.S. Air Force and the Joint Staff. He commanded the 32d Intelligence Squadron at Ft. Meade, Maryland. He deployed to Korea, Iraq and Afghanistan multiple times, to include as the J2, Director of Intelligence, Combined Joint Special Operations Air Component. Lt Col Rosenberg served in numerous international and political-military affairs roles, including Foreign Service exchange officer at the Tokyo Embassy, on the Joint Staff J5 Strategic Plans & Policy Directorate, and as an Afghanistan-Pakistan (AFPAK) Hand at the Ministry of Interior, fostering enduring relationships with senior government officials and the people of Afghanistan.
